1. Together for Humanity Interactive Presentations and Workshops:

Provides an opportunity for students to learn about diversity, commonality and question assumptions about identity with engaging, diverse presenters.

- Programs suitable for primary (years 3-6), and secondary students
- Comprises one hour presentation, and follow up workshops a few weeks apart
- Is conducted by at least three facilitators from diverse backgrounds
- Includes storytelling, values clarification, role play and problem solving
- And invites students to work together for a better world

2. Values in Action Together Program:

Offers more in-depth experience. Our diverse facilitators challenge & support your students to work with their peers from other schools with backgrounds different from their own.

- Two or more schools for 2 full days, over a period of at least one term, with ongoing support from TFH.
- For grades 5 – high school
- Is conducted by at least three facilitators from diverse backgrounds
- Includes storytelling, values clarification, role play and problem solving
- Expands cross cultural understanding, develops citizenship and communal responsibility .
- Builds real relationships across cultural and religious difference.
- Option to do joint service project, with ongoing support from Together for Humanity.

3. Doing Difference Workshops:

Unpacks the challenges of living with diversity, and teaches strategies for dealing with entrenched differences and areas of conflict: cultural , political and social.

- Adaptable program for specific school issues
- Includes problem solving, critical & divergent thinking, dealing with conflicting narratives, as well as the fundamentals of conflict resolution.
- Sensitive approaches entrenched conflicts.
- Develops listening skills, and techniques for self monitoring and reflection.
